1. Student Success and Student Learning – Ms. Gail Booth, Sr. Financial Aid Specialist, to attend the 2013 (FSA) Federal Student Aid Training Conference in Las Vegas, NV, December 3 – 6, 2013.

The Federal Student Aid annual conference is designed to provide the most up-to-date information on Title IV programs and the evolving federal policies and procedures. By law, schools are accountable to abide by and comply with the rules and regulations of the Title IV programs they administer. Ensuring the proper training of these institutions disbursing these funds is an investment in protecting the taxpayer dollars from fraud, waste and abuse. Sessions will focus on topics related to changes in Title IV regulations and legislation such as Gainful Employment, 150% Direct Loan Sub Limitation, Pell Grant Lifetime Eligibility Limits, Loan Repayment Options, as well as how to prevent fraud, and protect students' privacy and their load data. Financial Aid Professionals will also learn how to implement these changes at their schools, and will be able to practice face-to-face, hands-on using the student loan data systems, such as COD and NSLDS. There will also be staple sessions like new changes to the financial aid application and the protection of students on campus (Clery Act), as well as sessions on cash management and loan reconciliation.

Fiscal Implications: Costs estimated at \$1,100.00 and will be funded by a restricted source (Board Financial Assistance Programs (BFAP) funds).

2. Student Success and Student Learning – Ms. Christina Delgado, Director, International Education Program, to attend the ICEF (International Consultants for Education and Fairs): North America Workshop in Miami, FL, December 9 – 12, 2013.

ICEF is an organization that focuses on creating connections between educational providers and overseas education agents for the purpose of the recruitment of international students. The North America Workshop focuses on establishing meetings between US higher education institutions and overseas educational agents who are interested in recruiting students for the U.S. market. It is anticipated that through our participation in this workshop, we will be able to establish new marketing relationships leading to international student enrollment at the college and at the Intensive English Academy.

Fiscal Implications: Costs estimated at \$6,300.00 and will be funded by a restricted source (International Education Program Funds).

3. Student Success and Student Learning – Baseball team to attend a scrimmage game in Yuma, AZ, on Saturday, November 2, 2013.

As part of the baseball team's non-traditional fall season, they have scheduled a scrimmage game against Arizona Western College.

Professor Leuschner teaches Conservation of Natural Resources. Sustainability is the foundation of the course, and Professor Leuschner strives to be an expert in this area.

Fiscal Implications: Costs estimated at \$1,729.65 and will be funded by a restricted source (Perkins Travel Funds). This travel was approved by the grant monitor on 9/18/13.

5. Student Success and Student Learning – Mr. Eliu Benavides, History Instructor, School of Arts and Sciences, and Faculty Development Committee Member, to attend POD (Professional and Organizational Development Network in Higher Education) Conference in Pittsburgh, PA, November 6-10, 2013.
