TITLE: ACADEMIC SENATE RESOLUTIONS

BACKGROUND:

One-Stop Job Center: The Coachella Valley community has recommended the college create a central hub for career resources and services and the College of the Desert Foundation has asked the college to explore whether or not such a resource would be beneficial to student success and furthering the college's mission. In response to our community's request, the Academic Senate and College of the Desert Administration worked together to form a Discussion Group with membership from the following stakeholder groups: Students, community members, full-time faculty, adjunct faculty, classified staff, and administration. A robust and transparent dialogue resulted in the Group unanimously recommending a College of the Desert One-Stop Career Center. The College Planning Council voted to endorse the recommendations of the Group in November.

Canvas Adoption: This month, the senate passed a resolution to replace Blackboard with the Canvas Learning Management System. The Online Education Initiative (OEI), a collaborative effort among California Community College (CCCs). The OEI Partnership, sponsored by the Chancellor's Office, has chosen Canvas as the recommended platform for delivering online classes and will be covering the costs for four years and then offering Canvas at a discounted rate thereafter. Canvas was selected for the CCC's after an extensive review by the Academic Senate CCC, and OEI Pilot schools which included administrators, faculty and students.
