TITLE: GIFTS/DONATIONS TO THE DISTRICT

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Mr. Ivoj Kudrnac of Palm Desert, CA, has generously agreed to donate \$725,000.00 to the District for the purchase of a PlanWave Instruments 1-meter PW1000 Telescope and an Astrohaven Dome for the Observatory Project. This donation is in addition to the July 2016 donation of a PlanWave Instruments CDK17 observatory telescope and a cash donation of \$20,000.00 to help fund the observatory.

The PW1000 is a complete 1-meter observatory-class telescope featuring a direct drive altitude-azimuth (Alt-Az) mounting system designed and engineered by PlaneWave. With a diffraction-limited 100mm image circle, the PW1000 is designed to excel at imaging on the largest format CCD cameras available today. Light-weighted optics are made of zero expansion fused silica materials for excellent thermal stability and maximum throughput. The dual Nasmyth ports allow two instruments to be installed simultaneously, and a computer-controlled M3 mirror allows either instrument to be remotely selected in seconds. With direct drive motors, high resolution encoders, zero backlash and no periodic error, the PW1000 sets a new standard in 1-meter class observatory telescopes. The16-foot Astrohaven Dome includes a powered opening system that allows push button control or computer interface for remote operation.

TITLE: BOARD POLICY 6350 DEBT MANAGEMENT – 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Senate Bill 1029 was signed by Governor Brown on September 12, 2016. This Senate Bill requires local agencies, including community colleges, to certify that they have adopted local debt policies and that each contemplated debt issuance is consistent with those adopted policies.

Staff has been working with legal counsel over the past several months to develop a policy that addresses the requirements included in the legislation which are:

- The purposes for which the debt proceeds may be issued;
- The types of debt that may be issued;
- The relationship of the debt to, and integration with, the issuer's capital improvement program or budget, if applicable;
- Policy goals related to the issuer's planning goals and objectives; and
- The internal control procedures that the issuer has implemented, or will implement, to ensure that the proceeds of the proposed debt will be directed to the intended use.

First reading of this Policy was presented at the January 19, 2017 Board Meeting.
