#### TITLE: THE COMMUNITY PLEDGE

#### BACKGROUND:

College of the Desert is working to boost college going rates and help better prepare students for higher education, jobs and careers.

Education makes a difference for each student, their families, the community and the economy. Having an educated workforce attracts new businesses and industries, which in turn will create jobs that will keep more skilled workers in the community and support a healthy economy and quality of life.

The cost of higher education is a significant barrier for many low-income students. Research shows that removing financial barriers and providing the services and support students need to succeed in college can jumpstart social mobility for students who aspire to jobs and careers, and a better life.

This past year, College of the Desert was recognized by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office with the 2016 Chancellor's Student Success Award. The EDGE (Engage, Develop, Grow, and Empower) Program was developed to increase student success and combat the challenges students face in completing college-level Math and English courses. The strong success and persistence of students in the EDGE Program since 2012, demonstrates the effectiveness of the EDGE Program.

College of the Desert is committed to increasing the college-going rate in the Coachella Valley and increasing the capture rate of local high school graduates. Some improvement has been gained by strengthening partnerships with our local unified school districts. As another mechanism to further these increases, last year the Board of Trustees approved the Community plEDGE program, guaranteeing one year of college "tuition" free to all 2017 Coachella Valley high school graduating students.

The Community plEDGE provided additional funding for eligible EDGE students to assist with college tuition and fees for their first year at College of the Desert. The students receiving this assistance made a plEDGE to maintain full time enrollment while in the program, as well as participate in mentoring or internships, engage in community service, complete career preparation workshops and maintain grade levels.

The first year cohort of EDGE students who were able to take advantage of the Community plEDGE program are now enrolled full time in fall classes, more academically prepared to succeed, and facing fewer financial challenges thanks to plEDGE. College of the Desert will extend to these students that maintain eligibility the tuition and fees for the second year of their education.

In addition, the Community plEDGE will be extended to the Class of 2018 for two full years of tuition and fees to all students maintaining eligibility.

By focusing on recent, local high school graduates, the goal of the plEDGE program is to remove economic barriers to students by providing critical guidance, college readiness skills, and academic support essential to the achievement of individual educational and career goals. The plEDGE is a powerful commitment to the educational and economic futures of our students, college, and community.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATION:

Scholarship resources and community partner pledges will fund the program. College of the Desert general funds will not be impacted.

#### **<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>**:

College of the Desert extend the Community plEDGE program for a second year to the 2017 College of the Desert EDGE (Engage, Develop, Grow, Empower) Program students and offer two year financial assistance for college tuition and fees opportunity to the class of 2018 local Coachella Valley high school graduates.

#### TITLE: RESOLUTION NO. 091517-1 DESERT COMMUNITY COLLEGE DITRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES ADOPTING AN INITIAL STUDY/MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND A MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT FOR THE INDIO EDUCATION CAMPUS EXPANSION PROJECT

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Board of Trustees directed the College of the Desert to proceed with the planning required to expand the Indio Education Campus (IEC). This effort has included negotiations with the City regarding the purchasing of City property for the project, and the preparation of an Initial Study leading to a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project and associated Disposition and Development Agreement.

This expansion would consist of a new  $45,000\pm$  square foot, three story building, expansion of the existing plaza to provide connection to the existing building, additional parking to the east of the new building, and vacating the existing street, Civic Center Mall, for integration into the project as an entry drive from Towne Street.

The parcel on which the project would occur consists of approximately 1.3 acres, currently owned by the City of Indio/Indio Housing Authority. That parcel is currently partially developed, including a public parking lot on its eastern half, and an unimproved vacant area on its western half. The western half is used as a de facto parking area, as it has been graded and is devoid of vegetation. In addition to this parcel, the current right-of-way of Civic Center Mall, consisting of approximately 22,400 square feet, between Oasis Street and Towne Street, will be vacated. In total, therefore, the project site consists of approximately 1.8 acres.

The proposed building would be consistent with the mass and design of the existing campus building to the south and have a maximum height of approximately 68 feet, or up to 10 feet more than the existing college building to the south.

Access to the proposed project would be provided on Towne Street, which will serve both the existing campus and the proposed expansion. In addition, vehicles will be able to access Requa Avenue via an existing driveway on the existing campus.

#### **CEQA Review Process**

The IEC Expansion Project is a "project" as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The District, acting in its capacity as the Lead Agency for this project under CEQA, evaluated the potential environmental impacts of the project. It has been determined through the preparation of an Initial Study that although the project has the potential to result in significant environmental effects, the impacts will not be significant in this case because the mitigation measures described in the attached Initial have been added to the project.

The 20-day comment period ended on September 8, 2017. Comments were received from the City of La Quinta and the Imperial Irrigation District, and are attached to this staff report. Any additional comments received after distribution of the staff report will be provided to the Board at the hearing. The City of La Quinta had no comment. The Imperial Irrigation District informed the College of its requirements for electrical connections for the project. These comments do not affect the environmental analysis, and do not necessitate recirculation of the environmental document or the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report. Recommended Mitigation Measures have been incorporated into the Initial Study that will reduce any potentially significant impacts to less than significant levels. The Initial Study and associated Mitigated Negative Declaration meet the requirements of CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. A Notice of Determination should be prepared.
