#### TITLE: INITIAL PROPOSAL FROM THE DESERT COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT TO THE COLLEGE OF THE DESERT FACULTY ASSOCIATION, CCA/CTA/NEA

#### **BACKGROUND**:

The Collective Bargaining Agreement proposals submitted herein by the DESERT COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT are expressly pursuant to the Educational Employment Relations Act. It is the intention of the DESERT COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT to bargain in good faith over the proposals submitted by the respective parties to the CTA Collective Bargaining Agreement.

#### ARTICLE VIII COMPENSATION

Given the current status of the State budget and the unfavorable economic projections, the District expects to make economic proposals that will allow it to continue to attract and retain the best quality instructors, yet allow the District to remain solvent and sustain resources of the District. It is expected that these proposals may include proposals regarding salaries, placement or movement on the salary schedule, workload, and contributions to retirement plans.

#### ARTICLE X HEALTH AND WELFARE BENEFITS

Health and welfare benefits continue to be a nationwide concern as employers attempt to provide medical insurance designed to ensure quality medical care and plan design which maximizes cost containment. Costs have escalated for nearly 25 years, exceeding the general cost of living each year. Employers and employee representatives have continuously sought ways to control the escalating costs of medical insurance through various approaches, including changes in plan design, cost containment techniques, cost sharing, and other mutually acceptable strategies. The ever increasing expenditures necessary to fund medical insurance programs tend to detract from utilization of these monies needed for other important uses including employee compensation, educational programs and capital expenses. The District intends to make proposals regarding modifications to its current medical insurance plan benefits, including aspects relating to cost containment, efficiency, co-payments, cost sharing, retiree benefits, and other alternative approaches to minimize annual increased District expenditures for medical insurance.

#### ARTICLE XV COURSE SIZE

The District will make proposals designed to improve operational efficiency and the quality of education offered, as well as clarifying language regarding the establishment of course and section maximums and the elimination of outdated provisions.

#### ARTICLE XVII FACULTY SERVICE AREAS

In accordance with the applicable provisions of the Education Code, the District will make proposals establishing faculty service areas and competency criteria, as well as the procedures and timelines for applying, obtaining and maintaining faculty services, in order improve operational efficiency and the quality of education offered.

#### **BACKGROUND**:

In recent years, the College has been pursuing a policy of sustainable development and management at its campuses, including the Palm Desert campus. The proposed project is a continuation of the College's sustainability policies. The College of the Desert/Desert Community College District is proposing to install a fixed solar photovoltaic (PV) array on PV shade support structures over portions of existing parking lots at its Palm Desert campus. The campus is located at the northeast corner of Fred Waring Drive and Monterey Avenue in the City of Palm Desert, Riverside County, California. The Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND)\* was prepared in conformance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and evaluated potential environmental impacts resulting from the proposed project based on site plans and technical information provided by the College and the proposed vendor.

The project will be developed in partnership between the College and SunPower Corporation, a solar energy developer. It calls for the installation of a  $\pm 3,800$  kilowatt (kW) capacity fixed-angle, tilted solar PV system on PV shade support structures over campus Parking Lots 14 and 19, and the parking lot immediately south of the Craven Student Services Center. The facility is estimated to generate 6.262 million kilowatt hours of power on an annual basis. For the purposes of the study, these lots are identified as Parking Lots A, B, D, and E, as shown on Exhibit 4 of the IS/MND. Construction is anticipated to take approximately five to six months, with operation beginning soon thereafter.

The array will include 8,844 high-efficiency (435 W) solar modules on 31 stand-alone PV shade structures, as well as 3 inverters, and will require trenching to facilitate underground interconnection of modules and tie-in to the existing main campus electrical building east of Parking Lot A. The array will cover approximately 230,684 square feet of the parking lots. The system will have 6 modules per string, for a total of 1,474 strings. The array system summary table is provided below.

The system will include three (3) inverters: one each in Parking Lots A, B, and D. Inverters will be 6 feet tall and enclosed in mechanical-style cabinets; each will take up 2 to 3 existing parking spaces and be surrounded by fencing. PV shade support structures will be 14-feet tall at the lowest point (west side) and 19.3 feet tall at the highest point (east side). PV shade structures will be constructed in a north/south orientation, with panels facing on a bias to the west for optimal annualized sun exposure. PV shade structure dimensions, described in the table below, will follow the same nose-to-nose footprint of the parking spaces they cover. Upon completion, the existing parking lot layout will remain unchanged, and drive aisles will be clear and passable.

Construction access will be taken via the campus' Monterey Avenue entrance. Construction staging will take place within the project area and probably on parking lots 14 and 19. Parking areas will remain available to the greatest extent practicable, with restricted areas to be limited to minimize the amount of temporarily unavailable parking.

Construction will result in the removal of  $\pm 112$  existing trees and numerous light poles within the parking lot to accommodate support posts and PV shade structures. Trees will be recycled as green waste and replaced with shrubs and other low-profile landscape materials identified in the plant palette of the campus Landscape Master Plan. Other trees along the campus' Monterey Avenue and Magnesia Falls Drive frontages and elsewhere in the parking lot will remain in place.

Over a 25-year period, the PV system is expected to meet 60-65% of the campus' energy needs and result in avoided utility electricity costs of more than \$25 million. The proposed PV shade structures will also provide highly valued shade for on-campus vehicles.

#### **Environmental Setting**

The COD Palm Desert campus is located in the urbanized portion of western Palm Desert, on the valley floor in the central portion of the Coachella Valley. The foothills of the Santa Rosa Mountains are located approximately one mile to the southwest. The Whitewater River Channel, which is the primary drainage for the Coachella Valley, is approximately <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile to the north. Multi-family residential and golf course development is located to the north, across Magnesia Falls Drive, within the Monterey Country Club; and to the northwest, across Monterey Avenue, within the Rancho Las Palmas Country Club (in the City of Rancho Mirage). Development to the west and southwest includes two churches and professional office buildings. To the south are Fred Waring Drive and professional offices. To the east is the Palm Desert Civic Center, including municipal government buildings, parking lots, a skate park, and baseball fields immediately east of San Pablo Avenue.

That portion of the campus that is part of the proposed solar PV shade project is located in the western and northwestern parts of the campus. The subject site is immediately bounded by Magnesia Falls Drive on the north and residential development within the Monterey Country Club along the north side of the road. To the immediate west is Monterey Avenue and residential development in the Rancho Las Palmas Country Club (in the City of Rancho Mirage), two churches, and professional office buildings. South of the proposed solar PV project is the McCallum Theatre parking lot. To the east are COD campus buildings and other campus parking lots that are not part of the proposed project (see Exhibit 4 of the IS/MND).

#### **Environmental Review**

The District, acting in its capacity as the Lead Agency for this project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), evaluated the potential environmental impacts of the project. It has been determined through the preparation of an Initial Study that although the project has the potential to result in significant environmental effects, these impacts will not be significant in this case because the mitigation measures described in the attached IS/MND have been added to the project.

The COD PV Shade Structure is a "project" as defined CEQA. The District has evaluated the project under CEQA Guidelines and an IS/MND has been prepared and circulated for public comment; the 20-day comment period ended on December 5, 2012. No comments were received that would necessitate recirculation of the environmental analysis or the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report. Staff believes the analysis is a complete description of the project, its potential adverse impacts. Recommended Mitigation Measures have been incorporated into the IS/MND that will reduce any potentially significant impacts to less than significant levels. The IS/MND meets the requirements of the State of California CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines for the Implementation of CEQA. A Notice of Determination should be prepared.

### **CEQA Findings**

The District has determined and finds, based on the IS/MND and the record as a whole that:

- (1) The project will not:
  - substantially degrade the quality of the environment;
  - will not substantially reduce the habitat of a fish or wildlife species;
  - will not cause a fish or wildlife population to drop below self-sustaining levels;
  - threaten to eliminate a plant or animal community; will not substantially reduce the number or restrict the range of an endangered, rare or threatened species;
  - nor will it eliminate important examples of the major periods of California history or prehistory.
- (2) The project will not achieve short-term environmental goals to the disadvantage of long-term environmental goals.
